7:06: Bill Davis calls meeting to order and welcomes guests and board members

Announcements:

- Andy the condor passed away today. Bill gave a tribute.
- 2nd annual Kensington Street Fest Aug 19 2-8pm: everyone is encouraged to attend.
- The community council is sponsoring *Pints for Purpose*, 2nd Tuesday of every month 6-9pm at RoHa Brewery (30 Kensington Ave) which is the LWCC official “Cheers Tavern.” There are non-alcoholic options. 10% of the proceeds from the evening will go to Liberty Wells Community Council microgrant, Valerie’s fund.

Darin Mano, Community Council Rep

- Finalized CIP projects for current FY.
 - Added money to livable streets program for traffic calming from a data driven perspective. Other projects were also approved
 - Liberty Park and Jefferson Park greenhouses were not funded. Darin encouraged reapplying next year. Will discuss Community Council support at the next board meeting



- Request to annex land far west of SLC into the city boundaries. Developer has offered to do improvements which the community has been looking for. Darin would like input and will send information to Bill to post and share
- August 8, released \$10M for perpetual housing fund.
- Budget update: first budget amendment discussed on Tuesday - reallocation of funds that would have expired last year but weren't spent
- Discussed judgement levy – neighbors pay the bill for individuals that context their property tax and have it adjusted.
- Darin will look into what's going on with the Wells Ward building – for safety concerns, send pics to SLC Mobil app

Det. Fallows, community liaison for District 5

- Began overtime at the park to check for trespassers
- 2 cameras set up in Liberty Park: one at Chase Museum, other on the north end
- Reminder: SLC Mobil app is a great way to contact the city about issues, but it is NOT for reporting a crime. SLCPD.com should be used to file a report for minor crimes.
Mobil app note: Issue will be marked as “closed” which means it's been forwarded to the correct department (not that the issue has been addressed)
- July crime stats were shared and are available on website

- Community member, Alicia would like to advocate for public art installation at the unsightly triangle near 200 E 1910 S.
 - This would be a good candidate for a CIP project.
 - Also suggest submitting ideas via Valerie's memorial fund (community microgrant fund)
