Welcome, Introductions and Announcements

Seven Canyons Fountain semi-annual cleanup: November 4th – went well. It took ~2 hours for ~12 individuals to make significant progress. We will aim to do this every spring and fall (twice per year)

Submitted CIP Applications:

- Community Garden: 700E Coatsville Ave
 - Working with the city to incorporate the pedestrian byway into the plan <https://udotinput.utah.gov/700eastimproved>
- Public Art: 1910S 200E – Alysha moving forward, working with mayor's office to finalize the request
- Liberty Park Greenhouse – submitted by a private citizen. No word on the progress
- First Encampment Park – The First Encampment committee is gathering letters of support for the project. Please send your letters to Steve Hunt, vice-chair of the LWCC board.

Jeff indicated he has been working with the city on speed bumps along 300 and 400E. Would like to submit a CIP request next year.

City Council – Darin Mano

Topics discussed in last council meeting included:

- Affordable housing incentives ordinance finalized – trying to get more projects to include affordable housing. Hoping to have it adopted by end of year
- Joint declaration for world AIDS day
- Adopted Northpoint plan
- Made some changes to the historic preservation overlay

- Shawn and Mark, who live on Harrison indicated they've been having issues with civil enforcement on their street for a sight distance triangle violation (fence too high near an intersection) and also that a gate needs to be 17.5 feet from the sidewalk. It was noted that many houses in the LW community have similar configurations, the enforcement of this rule seems arbitrary and would be expensive to address. There are concerns about whether the civil enforcement agent is interpreting the law correctly and Shawn and Mark are looking for what recourse citizens have to push back. Darin will check the law and see if there is a possibility of creating a policy or an ordinance for a grandfathering clause while not compromising safety. Shawn and Mark to follow up directly with Darin.
